To John Martin £20 in case he should not obtain possession of the plantation at George's Creek where he formerly lived, and not otherwise. To my sisters Mary, Rachel and Rebecca Grubb the plantation where I now dwell, they paying to my stepmother Lydia Grubb £60 etc. Also to my sister Jemima Robinson £3 yearly during life. Executors: Brother Isaac, friend Thomas Gibson. Letters to Grubb, the other renouncing.

To my sister Margaret Williamson £5, and to his 3 brothers, Robert, John and Ephraim Gilmore £20 each, and to Alice and Mary Gibson £5 each. Executors: Wife Elizabeth, brother Ephraim Gilmore.

To grandchildren Andrew Lyon, Andrew Gibson Criswell, son of daughter Agnes, Andrew Gibson Criswell, son of James, Samuel Criswell Gibson, son of Thomas, £5 each at 21.

Executors: Son Andrew Gibson, Esquire and son-in-law James Criswell, to sell all real estate.
