Humbly Sheweth

That Thomas Gibson late of the
Township aforesaid did in his Life time Obtain a Warrant
from the proprietaries of the Province of Pennsylvania
for fifty Acres of Land adjoining the plantation where-
on he lived, and that a certain John Carothers had
a warrant of an Older date than that of Thomas Gibson
Some time after said Thomas Deceased and your Peti-
tioner and Mary the Widow of the Deceased Administred
on the Estate

Your Petitioner as Administrator went and got
the Warrant removed for the Benefit of the Orphans
and paid on a Tract of Account ~~in the Township~~
of ~~asford~~ for the Expences and Trouble of which he
Charged the Estate which was by your Honourable
Court left to an Audit of Three men who having met
once did not finish it but left it off to another time
which time your petitioner was Laying Danger-
ously Sick so as he was not Capable of pressing
any thing of the Matter yet, since the time they pro-
ceeded on and gave their Judgement by which your
Petitioner thinks himself Agrieved by the Manner
in which they acted he not having been fully
heard. He therefore prays that your Honours
would take his Case into your serious Considera-
tion and grant another Audit, or such Relief as to
you may seem just

I Writ hereunto annexed mentioned DO humbly make known and certify that by Virtue of that Writ on the *First* Day of *February* in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and *Eighty Seven* I took with me *Joseph Luckly Esquire Joseph Strawbridge James Strawbridge Isaac Casewell Charles Casewell James Casewell William Pinkerton Thomas Crosby Robert Coughran David Fleming James Gillilan Robert Paterson*

and in my proper Person went to all and singular the Tenements with the Appurtenances in the said Writ mentioned whereof *Alexander Gibson* Deceased in the same Writ named who died Intestate was seized at the Time of his Decease and there (having warned the Parties to be present according to the Command of the said Writ) by the respective Oath and solemn Affirmation of *the Free and Lawfull Men aforesaid*

I cannot cause the said Tenements with the Appurtenances to be parted and divided in such Shares and Proportions and in such Manner and Form as by the said Writ to me directed is commanded without prejudice to or spoiling the Whole. 

IN FORCE by the Order of the Court of Orphans, To the Sheriff of Chester County GREETING. WHEREAS James Gibson Isaac Gibson and Others the Widow and Children of Alexander Gibson late of West Allowfield Township in the County of Chester deceased

by their Petition presented to our Justices of our Orphans Court for the County aforesaid hath humbly shewn and set forth, That the said Alexander Gibson some time in or about the Year of our Lord died Intestate leaving a Widow named Mary and Issue via Children Grand Children viz James Mary Wife of James Fleming James Wife of Wm. Bryant Rachel Wife of Andrew Newberry Isaac Emanuel to Survive him That

Letters of Administration on his Estate were granted to Isaac Gibson one of the Petitioners Who hath finally settled the Accompts of Administration. That the said Intestate was in his Life Time and at the Time of his Decease seized and possessed of

which belongs to the said Intestate Widow Children and Grand Children according to the Act of General Assembly of this Province for the better settling Intestate's Estates

Praying that the said may be divided or valued according to Law. We therefore Command you that taking with you twelve free and Lawfull men of your Bailiwick

in your proper Person you to go to all and singular the Tenements with the Appurtenances whereof the said Intestate died seized or possessed and there by the respective Oath and solemn Affirmation of the said Free and Lawfull Men of your Bailiwick (in the Presence of the Parties

by you to be warned if they will be present) You Cause the said Tenements with the Appurtenances (having due Respect to the true Value thereof) to be parted and divided as followeth, viz. One full and equal third part thereof by meters and bounds to and for the said Intestate's Widow Mary during her natural life and the remaining two third parts thereof as hereafter follows to wit Two full and equal eighth parts thereof by meters and bounds to and for James Gibson the said Intestate's eldest son One full and equal eighth part thereof by meters and bounds to and for James Fleming in right of his Wife Mary one of the said Intestate's daughters One full and equal eighth part thereof by meters and bounds to and for William Bryant in right of his Wife Jane another daughter of the said Intestate One full and equal eighth part thereof by meters and bounds to and for Andrew Newberry in right of his Wife Rachel another of the said Intestate's daughters One full and equal eighth part thereof by meters and bounds to and for Samuel the other son of the said Intestate and the other full and equal eighth part thereof by meters and bounds to and for James Children of the said John Gibson deceased and grand Children of the aforesaid Intestate

But if the said Tenements with the Appurtenances cannot be divided in Manner and Form aforesaid without prejudice to or spoiling the Whole, then we command you that by the respective Oath and solemn Affirmation of the Free and Lawfull men aforesaid

You cause the said Tenements with the Appurtenances to be valued and appraised, and how you shall execute this Writ: you shall make known to our Justices of our Orphans Court for the County aforesaid forthwith under your Seal and the Seals of of those by whom you shall make that Inquisition together with this Writ.
