



Will<sup>y</sup> Be it Remembered that I George Gibson of the Township of up.  
 George Gibson I am Exposed in the County of Chester being weak in body but  
~~in sound mind and memory~~ taking into view the uncertainty  
 of Human Life and the propriety of settling my worldly affairs and as touching such  
 Estate as God has been pleased to bestow on me within this life, I give Devise and dispose of  
 the same in the following manner and form that is to say, First it is my Will and  
 I order that all my Just Debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate. Item, I  
 give and bequeath unto my loving Wife Clinor Gibson her bed and bed clothes  
 the best Case of Drawers and the Large Dining Table — Item, it is my Will and  
 I order that my plantation Mowens we now live shall be made use of by my family  
 until my youngest Daughter Mary shall arrive at the age of twenty one one year  
 which will in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty  
 one, Item, it is my Will and I order that as soon as my youngest Daughter  
 Mary Gibson arrives at the age of twenty one year, my Executors shall dispose  
 of my plantation at public Auction hereby authorizing and empowering them  
 to make a good and sufficient title for the same to the purchaser requiring them  
 to receive of the purchaser the sum, the same may be sold for — — —

Item it is my Will and I further order that out of the money arising from the  
foregoing sales, I give and bequeath unto my six Sons viz. John Currier, Thomas  
Jacob, George Washington, & William Gibson, and my Daughter Margaret  
Bigg the sum of twenty Dollars each to be paid at the end of one year after the  
Sale of the Lands; Item, I give and bequeath to my loving Wife Eliza Gibson  
one third part of the neat proceeds of my Real Estate, to be at her Disposal during  
her natural life and at her Death to Mr. B and Dispose of the Same as she  
thinks proper, Item, I give and bequeath to my other Children that is to say  
Joseph Elliot Gibson, Agnes Gibson the remaining two thirds of the proceeds  
of my Real Estate each Share and Share alike; — Item it is my will and I  
do order that my Son Joseph Elliot Gibson have and receive out of the proceeds of  
My Real Estate before any division is made the of one hundred dollars with one cent.  
Item I further give and bequeath to my two daughters, Agnes, & Mary Gibson  
each the the cent that the claim as their own proper right together with the  
Necessary bedding; — Lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint William Gibson  
& Joseph Elliot Gibson to be Executors of this my last will and Testament here-  
by revoking, and Disannulling all other wills by me heretofore made ratifying  
and confirming, this and no other to be my last will and Testament  
In Witness whereof I have here unto set my  
Hand, Seal the 14th day of August D. 1819  George Gibson

We certify that the foregoing Instrument of writing was in our presence signed  
published and pronounced by the said Testator to be his last Will and Testament  
and that we have signed this Certificate in presence of each other the day and  
Time aforesaid, — Robert Thomson, Nathaniel Crosby; —

West Chester November 4th 1819. Shere personally appeared Robert Thomson  
and Nathaniel Crosby, who being solemnly sworn according to Law did depo-  
se and say that they were personally present and did see and hear George  
Gibson the Testator in the foregoing Instrument of writing named signed  
Seal published pronounce and declare the same as and for his last Will and  
Testament, and that at the doing thereof he was of a sound and well dispo-  
-sosing mind and memory, to the best of their Knowledge and belief —

Be it Remembered that on the 4th day of November Anno Domini 1819.  
The last Will and Testament of George Gibson was proved and approved in Due  
form of Law and Letters Testamentary thereon were duly granted to William  
Gibson and Joseph Elliot Gibson Executors therein named who were solemnly  
sworn to exhibit a true and perfect Inventory of the deceased Estate into the  
Registers Office at West Chester on or before the tenth day of December next  
and to settle the account of their administration in one year from this date or  
when thereunto Legally Required. Given under my hand and Seal of said  
Office,
